Oct. 13: Arrival

Typical arrival times are anywhere from early afternoon to evening. Since you are all probably coming from the same flight then it will be much easier to arrange.

We will have a representative to take you through the immigration area. You will purchase a visa for \$25 before the immigration lines, OR you can get it ahead of time for only \$20 and just stand in line. Our guide will take you through the lines and then to the luggage carrousels where you will pick up your luggage. Then through customs where they will x-ray your bags one last time.

Our representatives will take you outside to a waiting bus, load your luggage, and you are on your way. I, Steve will meet you outside and ride with you to the hotel for our first night

LECTURE: We will have a room reserved for us. The first night I will introduce myself and since you will mostly know each other it will be a brief introduction to each other. Then we will answer the questions:

- 1) What do you know about Egypt?
- 2) Why are you here? What do you REALLY hope to see?
- 3) Where is Egypt in the Bible?
- 4) Timeline, Ages, and Dynasties



Oct. 14: Cairo Saqqara and Giza

We will start the day with breakfast in the hotel then leave on an hour drive to the Pyramids of Saggara:

- 1) Step Pyramid Complex: the oldest and first of all pyramids
- 2) Unas Pyramid: we will go inside this pyramid and see the old stone writing in Egypt and a special sarcophagus room.
- 3) Mastaba's of leaders: Leaders and family of the pharaoh wanted to be buried next to their king so they would have their tombs surrounding the pyramids. We will go inside a few and see the inscriptions there of every day life in Ancient Egypt.

Next we will drive to the pyramids of Giza, these are the GREAT pyramids you have heard of:

- 1) Pyramid complex: we will walk around the pyramids and take pictures ON the pyramids as you can climb up a few levels
- 2) Great Sphinx: we will go into the temple next to the Sphinx to get a eye level view of the great guardian.
- 3) Camel ride from lookout to the sphinx.

Onsite LECTURE: I will give minilectures onsite to let you know and see the biblical connections while we are at the site

- 1) Why did the Hebrews choose the golden calf to make an idol out of while there are so many other animals that represent gods in Egypt?
- 2) What is scripture? Was the writings of Ancient Egypt their scripture?

Oct. 15: Cairo Grand Egyptian Museum

Not much more to say here ... we will be at the greatest museum designed for only one culture: Egypt. Over 100,000 artifacts, including the complete collection of King Tut's tomb, within 872,000 square feet (81,000 sq mtrs).

I will give you a guide to help you find the most important things, and those connected to the Bible.



2) Nubian Museum



- Small boat ride around Elephantine Island


Then we will check into cruise for lunch and we will cruise to Kom Ombo for the late afternoon

Oct. 20: Luxor Luxor West Bank again

First, we will check out of the cruise ship after breakfast. Our second day on the West Bank (because there is so much to see) These are the sites we will see:

- 1) Valley of the Queens (including the famous tomb of Nefatari, the Sistine Chapel of Ancient Egypt, it looks like it was painted yesterday but it is over 3000 years old!)
- 2) Worker Village
- 3) Colossi of Memnon



We will go back to our hotel for an afternoon lecture and then go to the temple at night.



- 2) Civilization museum (Royal Mummies)


We should have time for a stop at Khan el Khalili for shopping at the oldest souk in the Middle East.
